Consumer Assistance Programs (CAPs)  (ACA Section 1002)  Timeframe: Now and ongoing	All consumers, at different income levels and with varying health coverage, including private insurance, subsidized coverage and Medicaid	<ul> <li>One-on-one education about public and private health care options</li> <li>Assist with eligibility, enrollment and plan selection</li> <li>Help navigate the health care system</li> <li>Troubleshoot problems</li> <li>Help consumers maintain coverage</li> <li>Capture information on successes and problems to share with government agencies and improve programs</li> <li>Assist with appeals and grievances</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Non-profit organizations contracting with a state</li> <li>State ombudsman programs</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Grants to states from federal government</li> <li>For all, funding directly to states         <ul> <li>Round 1: 2011</li> <li>Round 2: 2012</li> <li>Next round TBD</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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Navigators  (ACA Section 1311 (i))  Timeframe: HHS has a goal of operational programs by Oct. 1, 2013	People enrolling through Exchanges, but may provide services and referrals for public coverage	<ul> <li>Educate consumers on health care options</li> <li>Assist with eligibility, enrollment and plan selection</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Exchanges must create Navigator grant program</li> <li>At least one must be a community/consumer- focused non-profit</li> <li>Also can be a union, chamber of commerce, trade or professional association, broker</li> <li>Must be culturally competent</li> <li>Must have relationships with those likely eligible for Exchange</li> <li>May not receive any funding from insurers</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Exchange operating funds (not federal Exchange grants)</li> <li>Potentially other sources, such as Medicaid matching funds</li> <li>For state Exchanges         <ul> <li>Funding from state by Jan 2013</li> </ul> </li> <li>For federal and Partnership Exchanges         <ul> <li>Funding from HHS likely in spring 2012</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
In-Person Assisters  (ACA Section 1311)  Timeframe: HHS suggests operational programs by Oct. 1, 2013	People enrolling through Exchanges, but may provide services and referrals for public coverage	<ul> <li>Conduct outreach and education</li> <li>Assist with eligibility, enrollment and plan selection</li> <li>Must be distinct from Navigators</li> <li>Optional program</li> </ul>	The Exchange, or an entity contracting with the Exchange	<ul> <li>Federal Exchange grants</li> <li>For state-based and consumer assistance Partnership Exchanges         <ul> <li>States can apply for funds via Exchange grants now</li> </ul> </li> <li>No funding available for federal Exchanges</li> </ul>
